Introducing the Curtis W. Long, MD and Gay L. Nissen, RN Infusion Center

Curtis W. Long, MD, is a well-known figure in Bates County for several reasons. He has been a practicing physician since 1964 and was a pioneer in innovative medical practices, being one of the first, if not the very first, to perform laparoscopic surgery in Missouri in 1974. Above all, he is recognized for his dedication to giving back to the community.

Recently, he made a generous donation to support the newly expanded Infusion Center project at Bates County Memorial Hospital, which focuses on cancer care and other therapies. In appreciation of his remarkable generosity, the new space was named in his honor, and at his request, it also includes the name of his longtime nurse, Gay Nissen, RN, who has worked alongside him for over 40 years.

"The reason I donated to the center is that I wanted to give back to the community, which has been very good to me," Dr. Long explained. However, he felt it was important to clarify something.

"I made a mistake. I should have put her name first. She's the most important part of this; her contributions are invaluable. You have no idea how much work she has done for the community and the hospital. She has truly done a fantastic job for us. The patients love her and have complete confidence in her."

Gay, a registered nurse, had been working for BCMH for about 10 years when Dr. Long hired her in 1983 to assist with his primary care practice in Butler.

During the Open House for the Long-Nissen Center on July 21, community members had the opportunity to personally thank Dr. Long for his contributions. More recently, Dr. Long visited the Infusion Center to have his photo

A Legacy of Love

How One Young Photographer is Honoring Her Mother's Memory

When Ann Donnohue, Outpatient Specialty Clinic Manager at Bates County Memorial Hospital (BCMH), came across a collection of rural Bates County scenes on Facebook, she felt an immediate connection.

The images, showcasing peaceful landscapes of delicate wildflowers and feathery grass, beautifully captured the essence of the area. However, it was the young photographer, Reegan Koshko, who Ann believed could bring the emotional touch needed for the new Infusion Center at BCMH.

At just 17 years old and currently a senior at Appleton City High School, Reegan's childhood was touched by profound loss. When she was only five, her mother, Cheyanna Hellwig, passed away from breast cancer. Inspired by Ann Donnohue's request to contribute art to the new Infusion Center, Reegan, together with her aunt and uncle, Kaleb and Jody Hellwig, who serve as her guardians, chose to donate her wildflower photo set in loving memory of her mother.
